Dear Commissioner Scott,

While the town of Newington is a business friendly, pro-development community we, and neighboring towns/cities, are experiencing constant noxious fumes from the Sprague plant to the point where we cannot work in our yards without being sick.

This has been a continuous problem for over a year without correction. We have been notifying Sprague of the noxious fumes (at the request of DES) to no avail. This has not been a problem in past years until early in 2019 that we can recall.


