Police Chief's Report:

Spring us upon us! Tough saying after this last snow storm but I am a positive person. What does this mean? On Sunday, March 11th, Daylight Savings Time Begins and we get to Spring Forward, longer days, and warmer weather. This means more outside activities for most of us that we need to be aware of.

Runners, bicyclists, and motorcycles will be out sharing the roadways, so slow down and use caution. Runners and bicyclists; wear bright colored reflective clothing so motorists can see you from a distance. Follow the rules of the road: Runners run against traffic and bicyclist follow the rules of the road; single file and must adhere to posted traffic signs at intersections.

The Newington Police Department will continue to enforce and educate the motoring public on our roadways, to keep our community safe.

From February 1st to March 1st, your officers conducted 206 motor vehicle stops; issuing 180 warnings and 26 summons (tickets). Not all these traffic stops are from non- residents cutting through town to get to the Spaulding, so please pay attention to the rules of the road.

The Police Department will also be implementing new initiatives not only for speed enforcement but other moving violations.

Have a safe St. Patrick's Day and use common sense if you are out partaking in the festivities.

Town Planner Report

- 1. <u>Preliminary Site Plan Review 2061 Woodbury Ave, LLC, Tax Map 27, and Lot 2:</u> The Planning Board accepted Site Plan Review application for the proposed hotel as complete, and continued the application to March 26th.
- 2. <u>Pickering Marine LLC, 34 Patterson Lane:</u> The Planning Board will conduct a public hearing on the site plan review application on March 26th..
- 3. <u>Pet Smart:</u> Pet Smart received all their local approvals expects to open for business in a few months.
- 4. <u>Convertible Castle (aka Bernie & Phyl's), 30 Fox Run Road:</u> The Company issued a press release that they are coming to Newington and hope to be open by the summer season.
- 5. <u>The Storage Barn of Newington, LLC, 2299 Woodbury Ave:</u> The Planning Board approved the application with several conditions on February 12th.
- 6. <u>65 Nimble Hill Road:</u> The Planning Board approved the applicant / owner's application for a Conditional Use Permit and a driveway permit.

On March 26th, Eric Weinrieb, P.E. of Altus Engineering will provide the Planning Board with a comprehensive update on the improvement planned for Woodbury Avenue and Piscataqua Drive in 2018. The Board is concerned that Woodbury Avenue, in its role as a major regional thoroughfare, maintain its capacity to handle high volume traffic.
