

Private Well Water and Surface Water Use Questionnaires

The U.S. Air Force recently started a study, called a Remedial Investigation, to examine groundwater and surface water uses outside of Pease. As part of this study, the Air Force's contractor, Wood Environment & Infrastructure Solutions (Wood), is inventorying uses of groundwater (from private water wells) and surface water.

Participation in this data collection is voluntary, but encouraged if you have groundwater or surface water on your property. Information provided will be helpful in identifying possible impacts from Pease. Anyone who routinely uses private well water or surface water (from a stream or spring) on their property to water fruit, vegetables, livestock and poultry, or for other non-potable uses, is encouraged to complete this questionnaire.
